Janice Gline is Professor Emerita in the Department of Biological Sciences at Michigan Technological University, Houghton, Michigan, USA. She has a Bachelor of Science degree in elementary education from Frostburg State University, Maryland, USA (1962), a Master of Science in botany from West Virginia University (1964), and a Doctor of Philosophy in botany from Michigan State University (1968). She specialized in teaching freshmen in general biology and botany, and has taught ecology, evolution, systems ecology, and bryology.
