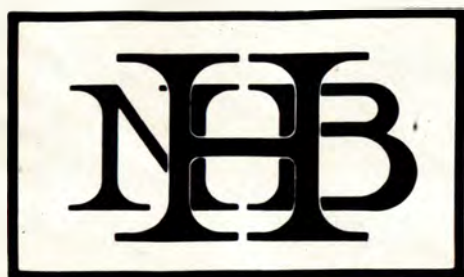

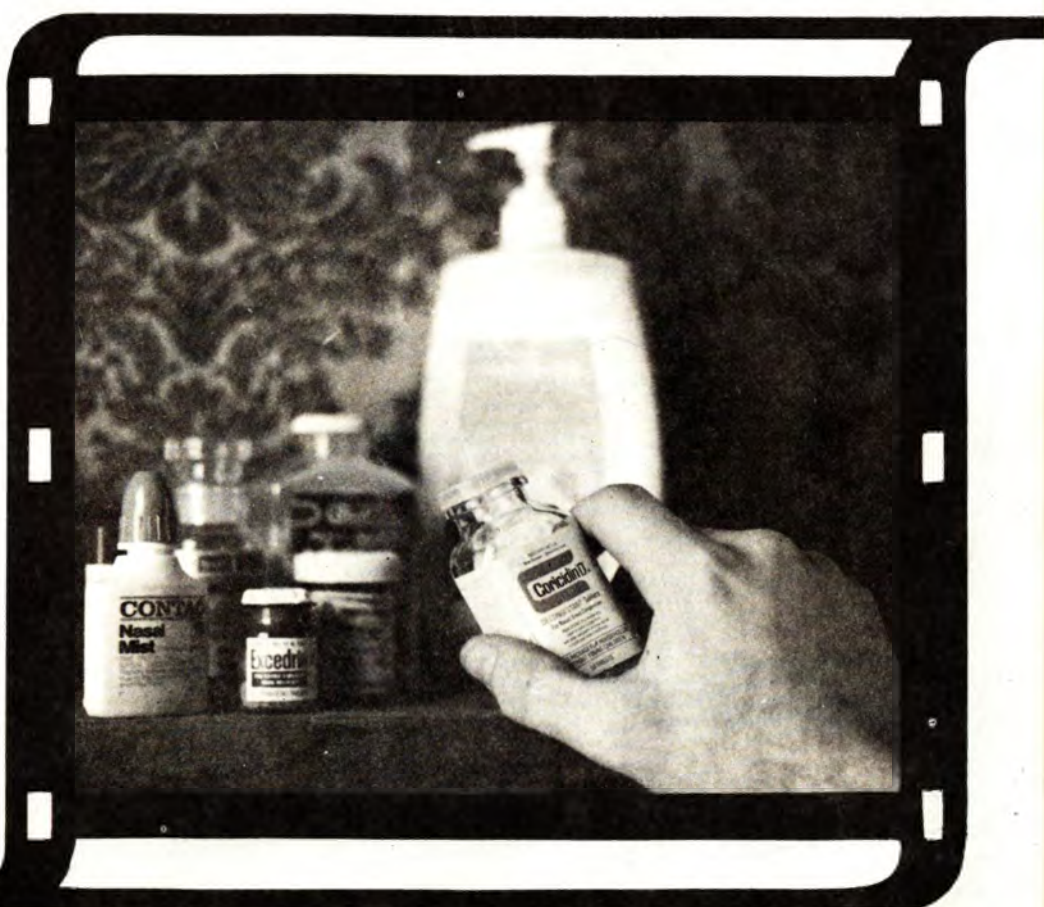
## The Frozen Obstacle

Of the four seasons winter presents the most hardships. Deep snow and blizzards force many people, especially the elderly, indoors. The crisp air steals heat from homes and money from the homeowner's pocket book. Slippery paths are the cause of many twisted ankles and hurt ego's. Colds and flu spread quickly leaving people miserable. Large accumulations of snow damage buildings and homes. Snow becomes an obstruction which has to be constantly brushed off of cars, plowed off the streets, and shoveled off of roofs.

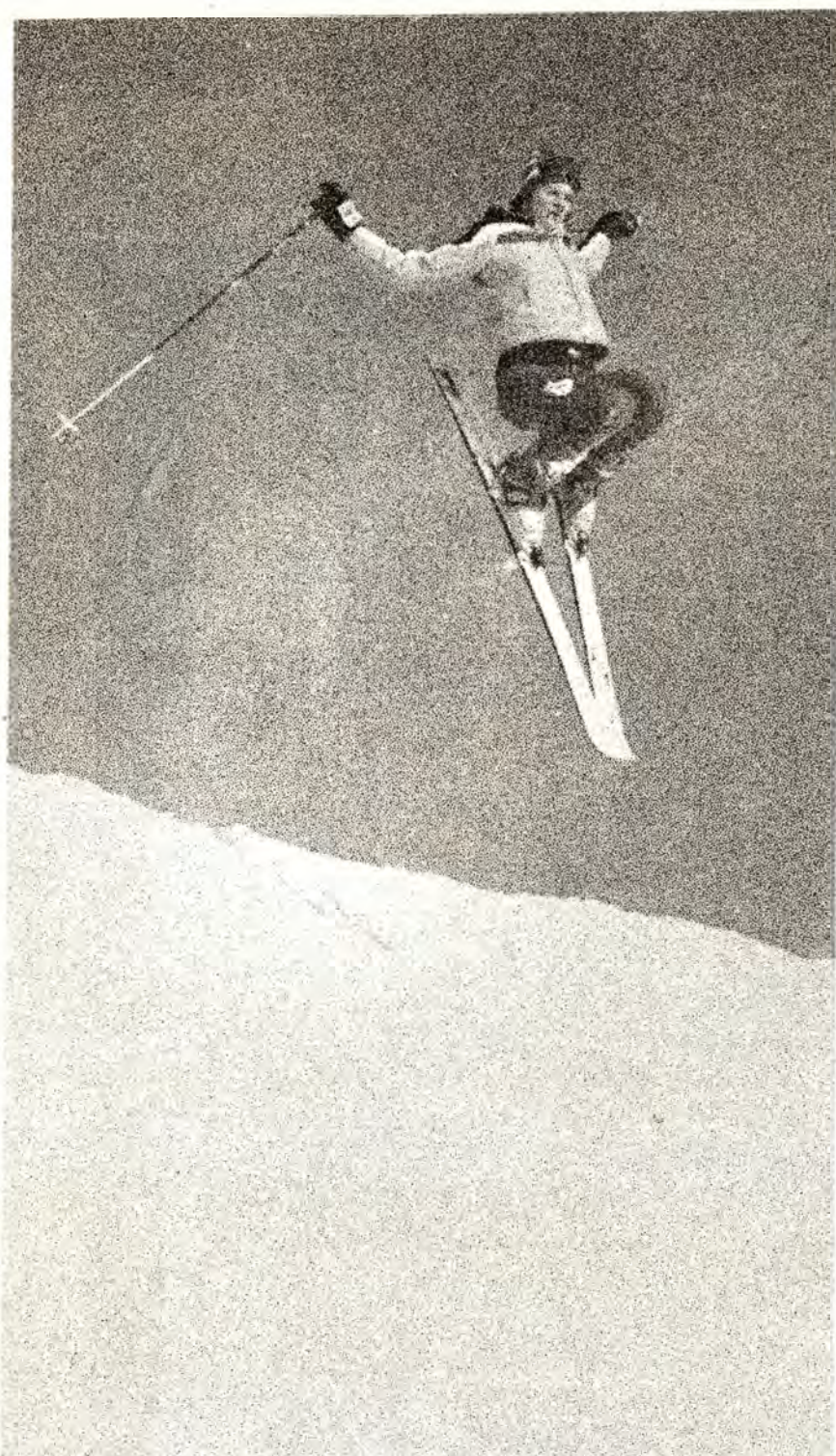
But how does one make winter bearable?











The degree to which a problem is solved depends on one's creativeness. A man in his seventies decided that he didn't want to shovel as much snow so he built a snow tunnel from his house to the street. Some solutions are more straight forward. If people are going to use cars in the winter the roads have to be plowed. Houghton County spends \$700,000 annually for snow removal. This involves the use of 5.5 million dollars worth of equipment and requires 80 men to work a total of 70,000 hours.

Over the years many winter activities have evolved that allow people to enjoy winter. Downhill and cross-country skiing are the most popular. Hard hitting hockey thrills both the participant and the spectator. Snowshoeing allows one to get away and experience the silence of a snow covered pine forest.

The students at Michigan Tech enjoy winter by participating in a Winter Carnival. Water, a little imagination, and an enormous amount of work turn towering mounds of snow into gigantic snow sculptures. The efforts of various organizations are recorded in this magazine. May their enthusiasm help you conquer your frozen obstacles.

## Dogsled and Broomball

The dogsled team consists of six pullers, four riders and one musher. Many of the pullers wear spikes in order to increase traction during the quarter mile race.

In broomball two six man teams try to score goals by hitting a volleyball with brooms into the opponents net. The rules are in accordance with those of hockey.



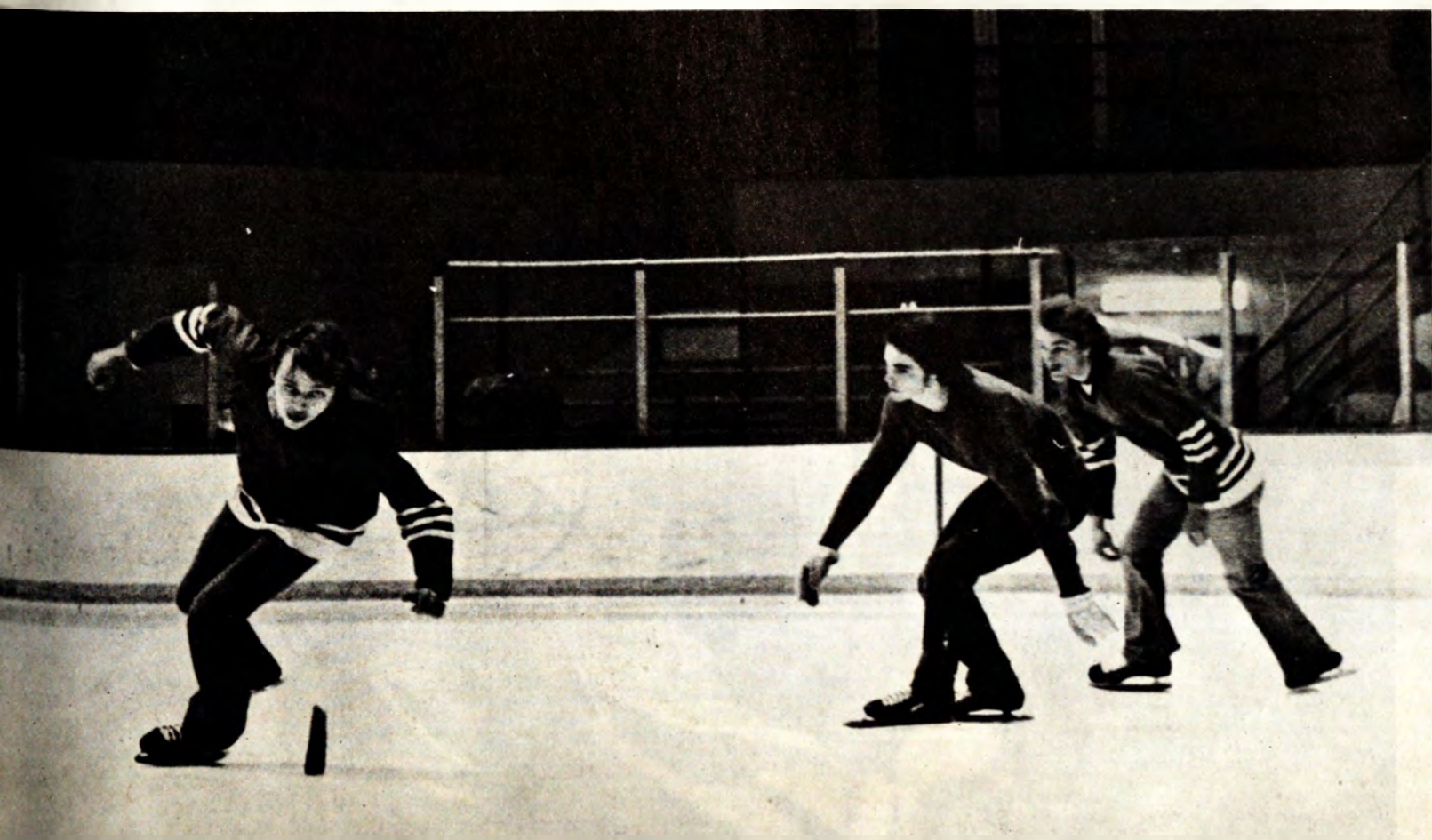




## Skiing and Skating

Skiing is conducted with a five man team with three of the men from each team qualifying. The giant slalom course is located at Mont Ripley.

Skaters compete in three events consisting of a 220 yard race, a 880 yard race and a four man relay.

The Winter Carnival Queen helps to judge four categories of new and old beards including full beards, goatee and mustache, side burns, and novelty. Snowshoers compete in two events. The first is a three man relay followed by a cross country race.

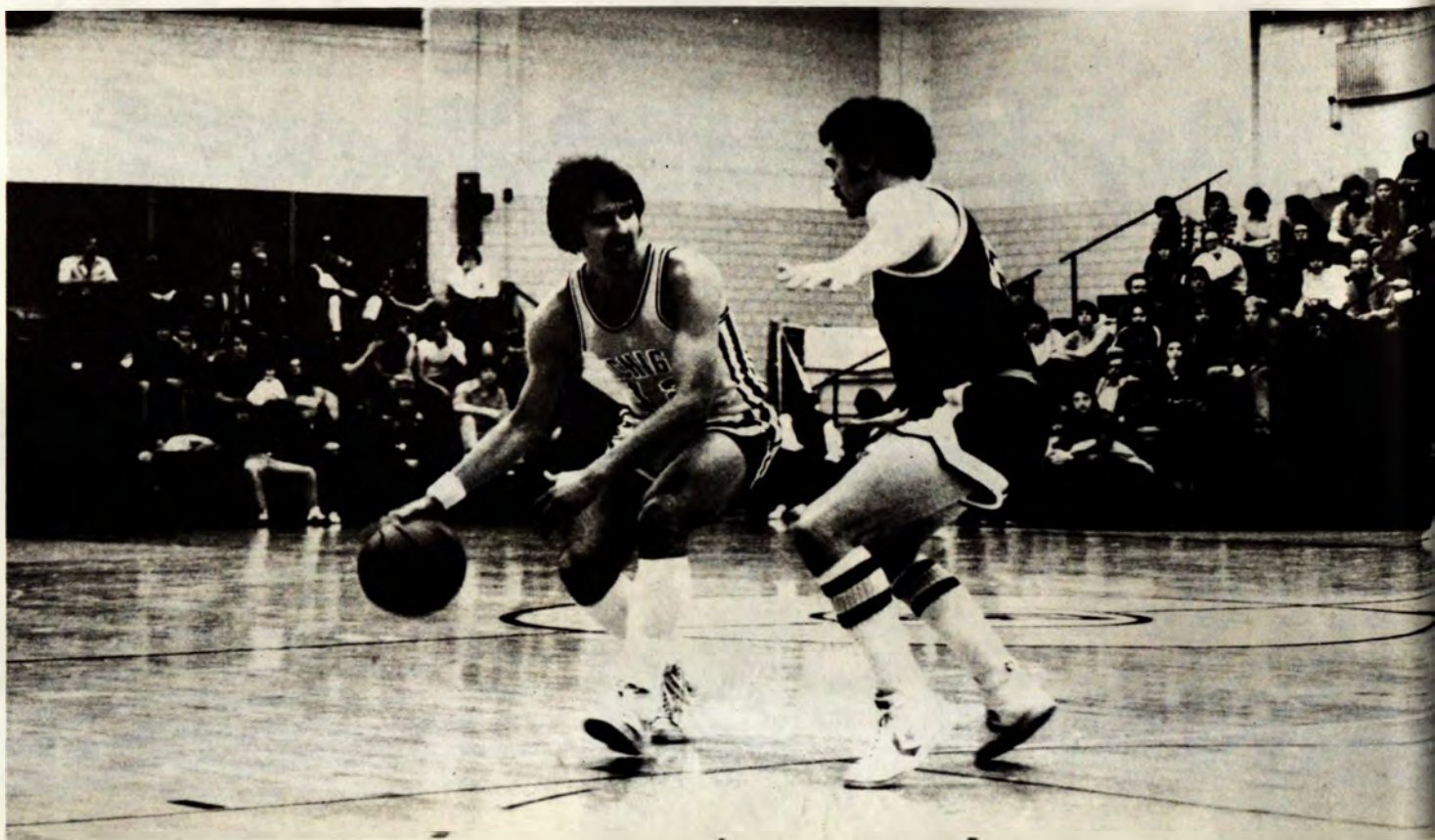




# HUSKY BASKETBALL

Michigan Techs Men's Varsity Basketball Team played two games during carnival week. The first against Mankato left the Huskies with a 65-81 loss. In the second game against Saginaw Valley, Michigan Tech avenged last years no show with a 66-56 victory. High scorers for Tech were Kevin Luke with 20 points, Geof Kotila with 16 points and Mike Susko with 13 points. Luke and Susko also held ground beneath the basket with 12 rebounds apiece. Fifty-eight percent of the points were scored from the floor.

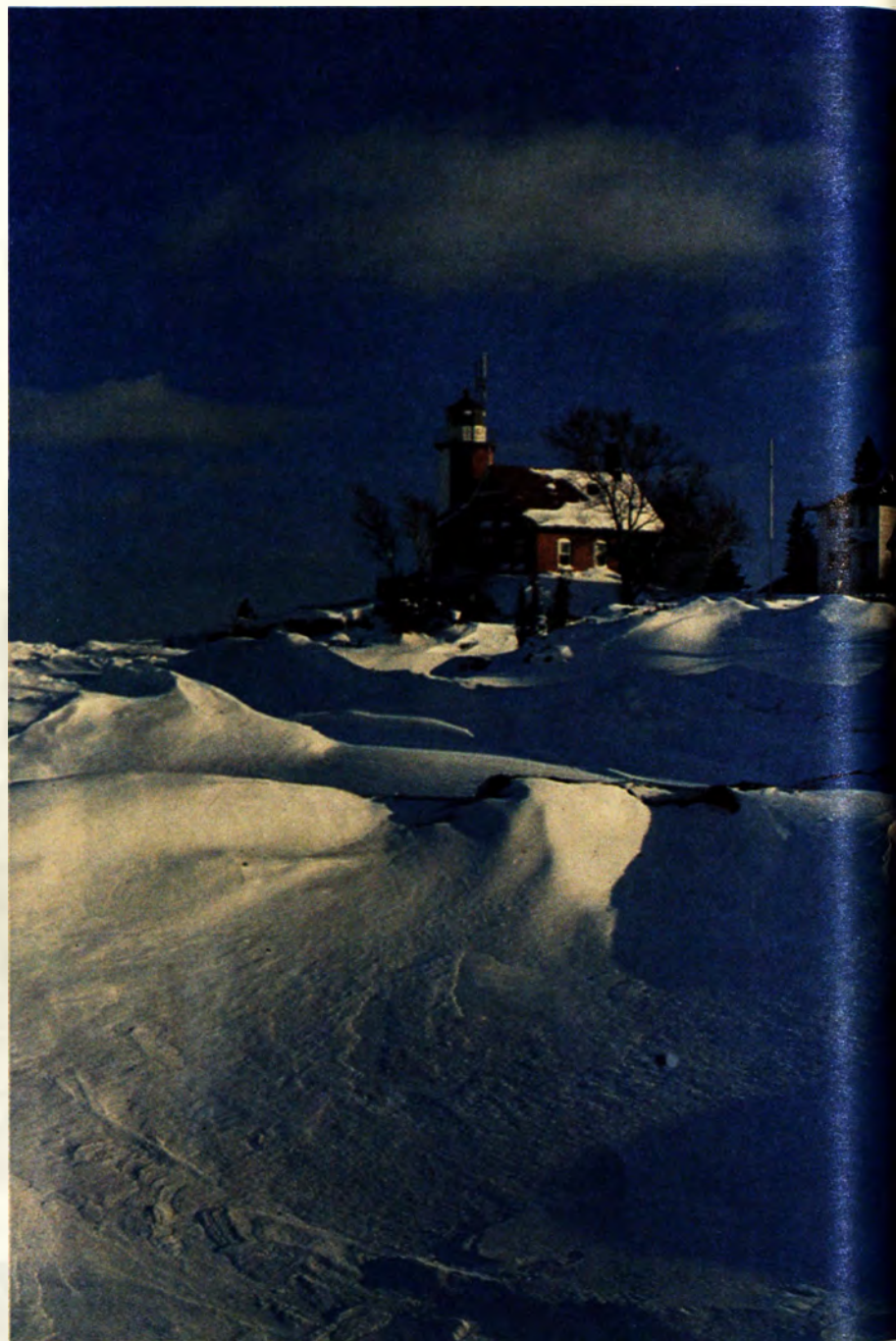

## Skit Preparation

Organizations spend as much time working on skits as they do on constructing a snow statue. Early in December each group holds a number of meetings to dream up skit ideas. At skit eliminations, a panel of judges decides which ten of the submitted skits will perform at the stage review. The pressure on the qualifying groups increases. Rehearsals become a nightly event and construction of props and scenery go full swing. The final rehearsals are conducted the weekend before carnival to let the sound and lighting crew practice their cues.
